LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

May 6, 2014

Dear Philadelphia Area Alums,

Welcome to our annual newsletter. Despite the winter's challenges, the Smith College Club of Philadelphia is going strong. We had a busy year filled with fun events and are planning many more in the coming months. Please join our activities and get involved!

Since our 2013 newsletter and the annual meeting at the Philadelphia Rare Book and Manuscript Company last May, we've organized nearly two dozen events. Highlights include a playground gathering at Franklin Square (May), an ice cream social and send-off for current students (August), a tour of the Michener Art Museum in Doylestown (September), a party to celebrate President McCartney's inauguration (October), our Fall Faculty Speaker event with Professor of English Doug Patey (November), our second annual "Smith Across the Decades" tea (held in March at Beaumont at Bryn Mawr and attended by seven decades of Smithies) and a visit to Yellow Springs Farm (April, see details on this and other events inside). We hosted the third-annual series of free career-related workshops with Smith's Colleen DelVecchio in January. We continued our monthly "On the 18th" events, which drew Smithies for after-work drinks, teas and other events around town on the 18th of every month. We started a new series of service-oriented events with a volunteer night at Philabundance (March). We also began participating in a consortium of Seven Sisters alumnae groups. We sponsored book awards to area high school juniors, and had a send-off party for students starting at Smith, then sent care packages for local current students that were delivered in time for both Fall and Spring semester final exams.

We broke last year's record with higher membership numbers this year and hope to continue the trend in the coming fiscal year. Thanks to all who became full club members by contributing dues! Regular dues support club activities, including care packages for current students, events for admitted and current students, book awards for high school juniors, etc. Dues paying members also receive discounted tickets for many events. On Thursday, May 29, 2014 we will be holding our Annual Meeting at the New Century Trust. More details regarding the event are on page 3. Duespaying members will be electing a new slate of directors. A second SCCOP book group which meets monthly in Center City was started in 2010 and has continued to grow. In December, this group added a "movie night" to their calendar. The group enjoyed viewing a film based on one of our selected books and comparing the two versions.

SCCOP RECRUITS AND SUPPORTS CURRENT STUDENTS

THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Started in 1940, the SCCOP Scholarship Fund is one of the oldest and most successful alumnae scholarship funds in the country. With help from donations from our Club, the Smith College Alumnae Association has provided financial assistance to many students from the Philadelphia region. Scholarships are awarded as grants in the students' financial aid package from the College. Donate today!

The endowed fund currently has a market value of \$1,792,329. In 2013, \$86,397 was awarded to several current Smith students from the Philadelphia area.

ALUMNAE ADMISSIONS PROGRAM

Alumnae Admissions Coordinator Carolyn Trench has the SCCOP Alumnae Admissions program in full swing! This program works closely with the college to encourage students from the Philadelphia area to apply to Smith and to give newly-admitted and entering Smithies a local welcome. With an awesome group of alumnae volunteers, the club has interviewed a dozen prospective Smithies, hosted an ice cream social for incoming Smith students in August 2013 at the home of Elizabeth Borland '97, and hosted our yield event – an afternoon tea for accepted students in April 2014 at the historic home of Andrea Pilling '76. Smith alumna volunteers have also attended college fairs in Philadelphia and the surrounding area and participated in a volunteer training workshop with Admissions Assistant Director Deedee Cleveland. We look forward to the upcoming send-off event for entering students this summer, and another successful admissions season this fall.

BOOK AWARDS

Each year the club reaches out to area high schools to identify a hard-working member of their junior class. That student is honored with a book, a certificate, and the opportunity to apply to Smith with no application fee. In 2013 the club presented 7 book awards and we aim to give twice that many this year.

CARE PACKAGES

The club also sent surprise welcome gifts to 11 students who joined the Smith community last fall. The students appreciated the gifts, which we know from the many thank you notes we received! Thank you to our club members whose support makes this program possible. We hope to see many of you when we gather to put together the next round of care packages!

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PAST YEAR

ALUMNAE VOLUNTEER IN THE FIGHT AGAINST HUNGER

On March 18, a group of club members volunteered at Philabundance, the Philadelphia region's largest hunger-relief organization. Together with another group of volunteers, SCCOP members packed up 720 boxes of canned goods, cereal, and juice that were then delivered to senior citizens in the area.
