In January, Smith alumnae came together in support of each other and women's rights at the Women's March on Philadelphia.



### **BOOK AWARDS**



Each year, the SCCOP reaches out to high schools in the greater Philadelphia area to identify a distinguished member of their sophomore or junior class. That student is honored with a book - *Gift from the Sea* by Anne Morrow Lindbergh, Class of 1928 - a certificate, and the opportunity to apply to Smith College with no application fee.

Since the revival of this program by the club in 2012 with three book awards presented, the club has increased the number of awards each year.
