The Smith College Club of Philadelphia (SCCOP) is the official Philadelphia-area chapter of the Smith College Alumnae Association. Driven by pride for our alma mater, our mission is to connect local alumnae with one another and to the rich cultural and social activities of the Philadelphia region. The Club also runs a range of activities to support and encourage current students and applicants to the college. SCCOP covers the Greater Philadelphia Metropolitan Area, which includes southeastern Pennsylvania, northern Delaware, and southern New Jersey. The Club aims to connect with the more than 1,000 alumnae in our area!

Club Membership

SCCOP plays a vital role in fostering alumnae connections in the Philadelphia region. While a dedicated team of volunteers leads the group, we rely on your membership contributions to make all that the Club does possible. Your membership dues send care packages to current students, host the annual send-off for accepted students, present local high school juniors with book awards, and cover the cost of club events. Many events are free, and members receive a discount on ticketed events. No matter how long you've been away from Smith, there's a vibrant Smith community in Philadelphia that would love for you to join!

Joining the Smith College Club of Philadelphia

Becoming a member of the SCCOP is an easy **two-step** process: complete the membership form so we have your contact information, and pay the appropriate dues for your membership level.

- 1. Go to http://www.phillysmithclub.com/membership to complete the membership form.
- 2. Pay dues online by clicking the yellow "Donate" button on the membership page to pay via PayPal. If you prefer to join and pay via mail, please send a completed membership form and your dues to the address listed on the page. A downloadable membership form is linked on the page for your convenience.

Club membership is valid for **one year** from the date you join.

- Annual membership dues are \$20.
- Junior membership dues are \$5. Junior membership offers the same benefits of the annual membership at a discounted rate to alumnae who have graduated in the past five years.
- Members of the most recent graduating class are eligible for a free Junior membership when joining within one year of graduation.
- All Smithies are eligible for a \$55 Ivy Day membership, valid for three years instead of one.

Book Awards

Did you know that the current President of the Smith College Club of Philadelphia found out about Smith when she received a Smith Book Award in high school? The book award tradition carries on! Each year, the Club reaches out to high schools in Greater Philadelphia to identify a **distinguished member of their sophomore or junior class**. That student is recognized with a book by a Smith alumna, a certificate, and the opportunity to apply to Smith College with no application fee.
